

Our Deanby girls have been back to school now for over six weeks and they have settled very well into our 'new normal'. At the moment we as a school, are all about the promotion of **Resilience** in our children -All children are capable of amazing things, regardless of their upbringing or the challenges they will meet along their life-journey. We cannot change what they will face along the way, but what we can do is give them the skills to cope with these challenges, so as they are strong enough to tackle them. In other words, we build their resilience.

Since returning to school in August, our dedicated staff have continued to support this by building well-being into daily class routines. We have also engaged Ciara Taggart from **Calmeleons**, who is supporting our girls by providing coping strategies for stressful situations through class workshops during September and October. We have reintroduced our **1K a Day**, making sure our children are getting out into the fresh air, which supports both well-being and resilience. We have re-engaged **PE coaches** in P4-7 with Damian from IFA and Rory from Ulster Council GAA. We hope that our Infant classes will also have PE Coaches in place in the near future. Each of our classes is also having a full day of **Well-Being**, where they have time to reflect and find out what de-stressors work for them. We have **Gardening Activities** with Linda and Alex from **North Belfast Women's Initiative Support Project** which will be

running all year and from mid-September, we will be running a **Forest Schools** programme for two of our classes from mid-October.

Resilience is all about being able to bounce back from stress, challenge, tragedy, trauma or adversity. When children are resilient, they are braver, more curious, more adaptable, and more able to extend their reach into the world. The great news is that resilience is something that can be nurtured in all children and here in Our Lady's, it is a particular focus for development across all of our year groups.


